The main purposes are to enable IPC Shooting athletes to get accurate classification at grass roots level as well as to enable them to attain best results based on their eligibility.

- The participation cost for this workshop is **200€/participant** and the participants will be invoiced by IPC Shooting.

- The travel costs will be covered by the participants.

Attendance	A 2-day IPC Shooting Classification Workshop.
Levels	<p>Trainee After the successful completion of the 2-day course the Classifier will be able to classify his/her own country's shooters. In case that these athletes participate in International Competitions their National Classification will be ratified by an International Panel of Classifiers.</p> <p>Level 1 In order for a Trainee to become IPC Shooting International Classifier of Level 1 the following steps must be followed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintain the National status by completing 20 classifications in their home country • These classifications to be validated by an International Panel at a competition or complete 20 classifications at an International competition under supervision. <p>Level 2 For upgrade of Level 1 International Classifiers to Level 2 see attached pathway</p>
Costs	<p>Costs for attendance at an International Competition in order for a Trainee to complete these 20 supervised classifications will be covered by the participant or their home country.</p> <p>The only case that travel and accommodation costs will be covered by the organizers is when certified classifiers will be selected by IPC Shooting in order to attend International Competitions.</p>
Certification	<p>Trainee Upon successful completion of the workshop and examination, a Certificate of attendance in the course will be issued The classifier would be a very valuable resource to their NPC in line with the IPC Classification Code.</p>
