

IPC SHOOTING REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS FACT SHEET

Summary

The IPC Shooting Regional Championships are a moderate size International competition for athletes with a disability. Previous Championships have been successful in terms of athlete performances and logistical support. The Championships can be open to athletes outside of the region should the Organizing Committee and IPC Shooting mutually agree and it is in the best interests of the sport and manageable by the LOC.

Schedule

Activity	Scheduling
Arrivals <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Athletes • Technical Officials 	Start 2-3 days prior to Opening Ceremony until 1 day prior to OC (including the day of the OC) Start 3-4 days prior to OC in order to have two (2) full days of operations.
Training <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unofficial Training • Pre-Event Training 	Start 2 days prior to OC Start 1 day prior to the first day of competition. Finish last day of competition
Classification	Start 2 days prior to OC (Countries with athletes to be classified must arrive no later than the classification evaluation period start)
Opening Ceremony	Scheduled to maximise spectator attendance and media coverage
Competition Days	5 days
Duration of the event	7-8 days
Closing Ceremony	Held on last day of competition
Departure	Finish one day following closing Ceremony according to flights availability

Competition Venues

Indoor

- 10m Rifle and Pistol Range (40 Firing Points)
- Electronic targets for finals

Outdoor

- 25m Pistol Range (20 Firing Points)
- 50m Rifle and Pistol Range (40 Firing Points)
- Electronic targets for finals on 50m range

Doping Control

LOC's must provide at their expense a comprehensive doping control programme in accordance with the provisions stipulated in the IPC Anti-Doping Code and as agreed to with the IPC in a doping control agreement.

Accommodation and Transport

Past Championships organisers have provided for athletes and NPC team officials hotel style accommodation with accessible transport to and from ports of entry, training, and competition sites. Accommodation facilities and services have been equivalent to a 3 star European standard, wheelchair accessible and generally suitable for people with a disability.

Championships Officials and the media have been accommodated in a separate location/area from that of athletes and NPC team officials. Additionally, a sufficient number of 3 to 4 star European standard hotels for the Paralympic Family and guests are also required.

Sponsorship

The LOC is granted certain commercial and proprietary rights to use in promoting and gathering support to host the Championships.

However, the LOC must provide the first right of refusal to corporations included in the IPC's International Marketing Programme for any sponsorship opportunities developed to support the Championships.

Media

The most recent edition of the IPC Shooting Regional Championships had approximately 5 accredited media (written and photographic press) and local television coverage.

Budget
